English Year 1 and Year 2

This week, the English sessions will build up to your child writing a character description. The character description will be based on the main character of a short clip – Partly Cloudy! Children may need to watch the film several times over the week to recap their memory. It is important your child follows each day in order as each lesson will build on the previous lesson and they will need to refer back to work they have done previously to support them in their learning.

<p>Watch the clip –</p> <p>https://www.literacyshe d.com/partly-cloudy.html</p> <p>What happens in the story? Who are the main characters? What emotions do the cloud and the stork (bird) feel?</p> <p>Can you make a list of all the different emotions the cloud and the stork feel?</p> <p>Give reasons for your emotions.</p> <p>E.G The clouds feels excited because the stork has come to see him></p>	<p>Watch the clip again.</p> <p><u>Activity</u> –</p> <p>Write a description of the Stork (At least 5 sentences).</p> <p>E.g. The stork has fluffy feathers and a long, sharp beak.</p>	<p>Recap what happens in the film.</p> <p>Act out the story - you could include members of your family.</p> <p>Try to verbally retell the story in full sentences while you act it out.</p> <p>Try to use time words such as First, Next, After that, Finally.</p>	<p>Writing - Retell the story from start to finish.</p> <p>Remember to include a beginning, middle and end.</p> <p>Don't forget to include your writing expectations in your story.</p> <p>(Please see below for each year group's writing expectations)</p>	<p>Continue writing their story of Partly Cloudy.</p> <p>Once children have finished their story, give them time to read back their writing and edit/improve.</p>

Please send a photograph of your child's end piece for writing for the week to their class teacher for them to have a look at and make a comment.

Writing Expectations

Year 1

Please encourage your child to use -

- Write in full sentences
- Correct use of capital letters and full stops
- Letters formed correctly
- Finger spaces
- Adjectives
- The use of the conjunction 'and' to connect sentences together

Year 2

Please encourage your child to use –

- Punctuate sentences correctly (capital letters, full stops, commas in lists, question marks and exclamation marks)
- Expanded noun phrases, adjectives and emotions
- Conjunctions
- Subordination – because, when, that, if
- Coordination – and, so, but, or
