I would like you to make either a poster/leaflet telling me all about the River Aire.

Here is a list of questions to help you carry out your research on this river!

1. Where is the River Aire?
2. Where does the River Aire begin?
3. Where does the River Aire end?
4. How long is it?
5. How wide is the River Aire?
6. Does it join the sea?
7. What is the name of the sea that it joins?
8. What is the name of the longest river in Britain?

You could also find out the name of the longest river in the world!

Once you have completed your research and created a poster/leaflet to present your information you can now make your very own boat to journey the sea! You can experiment with the materials you use to make your boat and see which material works best. Now you have made your boat it's time to put it to the test! Fill a water tank/ water tray with water, place your boat on the water and see what happens (you may need an adult to help you fill the tank with water!).
